## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANI:

I grew up hearing the phrase “April showers bring May flowers,” but what comes after tornadoes that show up in March?

Iowa weather is full of surprises. I'm used to seeing snow one day and 70°F two days later. But I was surprised to hear a tornado would come through our community this early in the year! Regardless of my surprise, we witnessed some of the most devastating tornadoes in the Midwest in recent years on March 5, 2022. My heart, like many of yours, broke at the news that our loved ones and friends had terrible damage to their homes and properties. I heard and drove by the damage where roofs were missing, windows were shattered, livestock were yet to be found, and families were displaced. So much has been lost and gone. Devastating storms like tornadoes provide us with a death of future dreams and plans.

As Easter approaches, however, I'm thinking about what the Christian faith has to say about life after death. On Good Friday and Holy Saturday, we grieve the death of Christ, and we are reminded of our own mortality. Then on Easter morning, when we celebrate God's incredible power through Christ's resurrection, we bear witness to the indescribable power God presents to us in life after death. On Easter, we become more than people who grieve. Because on Easter, we become people of hope and love. On Easter, we proclaim that life can be found even after death.

When I visited with families in our community who had experienced such devastation after the tornadoes on March 5, each and every one of them reminded me of the promises of *life*. So much devastation occurred, but everyone (from the Tingley family to the Jacksons & Persons) gave thanks for life. They said, “things can be replaced; people can't” and “we're so grateful that everyone is safe.”

Brock Jackson woke up the morning after the tornadoes and called his football coach at Central College to tell him that he wouldn't be able to attend weight-lifting practice that afternoon. Brock's coach asked what happened and after Brock told him, his coach said, “give us an hour and we'll be there.” An hour later, the entire Central College football team arrived at the Jackson/Person properties to clean up, rebuild fences, and help find livestock.\* Signs of life after death showed up that morning in the people who showed up, cleaned up, and brought hope with them.

Resurrection doesn't teach us to forget the pain of the past or the grief that accompanies death. Resurrection is a celebration, however, that death doesn't get the final word. We'll find resurrection again on Easter this year, but I believe we've already seen these signs of hope, joy, and life after death in our midst.


So, if April showers bring May flowers, then what comes after tornadoes in March? I believe what comes next is resurrection.


