This is a great time to invite family and friends to church for worship and a time of food and fellowship. There are some invitation cards available on the sign-up table. These can be used as invitations to family and friends.




EASTER LILY ORDERS

LENTEN MISSION PROJECT FOR 2025 LA CASA DE ESPERANZA (HOUSE OF HOPE)

La Casa de Esperanza is this year's Lenten mission project. Its main focus is fulfilling the Great Commission, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with people in remote areas of Peru. One of its ministries is a residential home for girls who want to attend secondary school. Many of the girls live in remote villages in the jungle and need a place to stay during the school year. La Casa de Esperanza is a Christian ministry that provides shelter, food, uniforms and school supplies for the girls. God is blessing this

ministry. This year, the number of girls being served is expected to triple, from 8 to 24, which means the cost to house the girls will also increase.

Other programs include offering youth camps twice a year and resourcing local pastors with Bibles and study materials. Donna Gustafson is the founder and director of La Casa de Esperanza. She grew up in the Des Moines area. She retired from Blue Cross/Blue Shield and sensed God calling her into the mission field. Using her own funds she purchased a piece of property and started this ministry. She is seeking support from individuals and churches to help fund this growing mission.
