A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOYCE:

A little more than a year ago, my husband Rich and I moved to Urbandale. After living in a parsonage for eight years, we had to buy a new house. This was during the crazy real estate market. We looked at several potential homes and one of the things we looked for was whether the house had *good bones*. Does it have a good floor plan and enough space for us? Is it structurally sound? Has it been maintained through the years?

We could also ask this question of the church. Does this church have *good bones*?

The Centennial UMC has been at this location for nearly 150 years. But a church is more than just the physical building. The *bones* of the church are the people. The people are the building blocks. The writer of 1 Peter says *you are living stones that God is building into his spiritual temple.* The walls of the spiritual house (the church) are strengthened as each person grows in faith and as each adds his or her gifts to its construction.

In September, we had a Nominations / Leadership Meeting. As we were looking at the ministry slots that we needed to fill, one clear lament is that the church is different today than pre-COVID. There aren't as many people willing to do the work of the church, which makes it difficult to do all the things we used to do...or the new things God might be calling us to for his Kingdom.

Friends, you are a living stone...and it doesn't matter if you're eight or eighty...the church needs you. The church needs your experience, your expertise, and your spiritual gifts.

In order for the church to do the work of the church, it's important for all of the building blocks (all of us) to find a place to serve and use our gifts for ministry. It's easy to say... I did my time (like it's a prison sentence). Or think... somebody else will do it, which means that either nobody does it, or people who are already doing too much, end up trying to do one more thing.

Here's my invitation (and challenge), pray about where God might want to use you in this next year, for the work of the church and the Kingdom of God right here in this place.


SUNDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2023 - 3:00 pm - 5:30 pm
