A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOYCE:

Did you know that the church has a pathway for discipleship? It's a way for church members to center and focus their attention on what it looks like to grow as a disciple of Jesus. In some ways it also helps to identify what we value. The Pathway was created by Pastor Dani and the Council on Ministries a few years ago, so some of you may already be aware of it. For others, you might be hearing about it for the very first time. The Centennial UMC Discipleship Pathway has three components, identified by three "F's." Let's look at them one at a time:

Faith: A disciple of Jesus Christ will take responsibility for growing in their faith. They will be intentional about reading and meditating on the Scriptures, they will take advantage of Bible studies and small groups offered by the church, and they will attend worship regularly. Living a life of faith is about building a solid relationship with Jesus Christ.

Fellowship: Recognizes that we are better together than apart. It's about being together. That's why worship is important, along with sharing meals and doing other activities together. A disciple recognizes the importance of community.

Flourish: John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, referred to flourishing as "sanctification," becoming more like Jesus, in our love for God and our neighbor. The point is that being a disciple of Jesus doesn't have an end point because with God's help, we're continually growing and being transformed.

There you have it...Faith...Fellowship...Flourish...

These are general terms, and it will be up to each of us to assess where we are on the path and determine the next steps that will help us get a little further down the discipleship pathway. Some simple ideas include making a renewed commitment to attend worship regularly, participating in a church ministry, attending a Bible study or small group (opportunities will be published soon), or participating in a fellowship or outreach activity.

Discipleship is a journey. So challenge yourself to determine your first step...then you can take the next step...and the next after that.

Friends, I want to leave you with this thought...Jesus loves you and he wants a deeper relationship with you. How will you respond to the invitation?



New Wednesday Adult Bible Study – 6:00-7:00 pm The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life

How do we walk with Christ--daily follow him, grow in him, and faithfully serve him? In the Gospels, Jesus modeled for us the Christian spiritual life. The apostles taught it in their writings. And the Church has, through the last 2,000 years, sought to pursue this Christian spiritual life. In this <u>six-week video-based study</u>, Adam Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. Each of these practices is intended as part of our daily walk with Christ while also being an essential part of growing together in the church.


